Opening Prayer – Kathryn's prayer offering was devoted to her Catholic education at the Academy of Our Lady where she was taught by the School Sisters of Notre Dame. The Foundress of the School Sisters of Notre Dame was Caroline Gerhardinger who became a certified teacher at the age of 15. In 1835, Caroline professed her religious vows and took the name of Mary Theresa of Jesus. Her life work, helping women and children grow to their greatest potential, was the founding principle of the School Sisters of Notre Dame. An educated woman was very important as "women would be the heart of the home." Kathryn then led the council in a prayer petition and the council responded, "We Ask Your Help."
